LET US HAVE YOUR VIEWS!

Lumphanan Paths Group has secured a grant from Scotways and Paths for All to improve signs on walking routes from Tullochvenus, through Lumphanan, to Kincardine O Neil.

Following negotiations with landowners we have now drawn up proposals and seek comments. The aims are that signs should:

- provide clear route finding, but avoid cluttering the landscape/townscape, so keeping signs to a minimum. We'll produce a leaflet showing the routes to complement the signage.
- be appropriate to the setting, so metal signs adjacent to roads at the start of routes, and timber posts in rural places.
- be considerate of landowners' operations.

Alongside this we propose signs on selected gate posts about control of dogs around stock and wildlife, and reminding path users to close gates.
